We invite you to join us for our annual rug hooking retreat!

Location:

The Drury Plaza is conveniently located right off I-65 approximately 18 miles south of Nashville, TN. The area surrounding the hotel is filled with shopping and lots of restaurants. Beautiful historic downtown Franklin is just 4 miles away and lined with antique shops, boutiques, galleries, and delicious eateries. For the history buff, there are three interesting civil war properties to tour. You may also want to visit the Arrington Vineyards, which is a short drive away. Golf courses abound for those spouses who wish to tag along and play a few rounds. The October weather is delightful in Tennessee! Make it a true Tennessee vacation and extend your visit before or after our retreat.

The Retreat:

We offer 6 nationally known teachers with room in each class for 15 students. Join us for a Meet and Greet on Sunday evening to check in, meet your teacher and get settled in your spot. Instruction hours are 9:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday – Thursday with a break for a catered lunch at noon. Evenings are on your own for dinner. You may return for evening hooking in the conference room until 10pm.

Fees (due with registration form):

\$430.00 tuition for residents staying at the Drury Plaza

\$480.00 tuition for commuters

Your tuition fee includes 4 days of instruction, light snack/dessert at the Meet and Greet, 4 catered lunches and beverages throughout the week. Dinner is on your own at the many restaurants in the area or stay for the evening KickBack meal at the Drury Plaza.

Lodging:

The Drury Plaza has extended us a discounted room rate of \$159.00 per night, double occupancy, plus tax. Your reservation includes: a hot breakfast, free wireless Internet, free parking, complimentary KickBack hot food buffet and complimentary adult beverages from 5:30 pm - 7:00 pm. There is free soda and popcorn in the lobby from 3:00 pm to 10 pm. All rooms are provided with a TV, microwave, refrigerator, coffee maker, iron, and hairdryer. The hotel also features a pool and fitness center.

You must reserve your room by Wednesday, September 18, 2024 to receive the special rug retreat rate! Your stay at the Drury Plaza helps support our rug hooking retreat. (Please note that the Drury Plaza books their rooms up to one year in advance, so 2024 room reservations can be made starting on October 26, 2023).

Please note that due to the hotel's liquor licensing, we are not permitted to bring outside liquor into the meeting rooms.

Retreat Store:

For your convenience, Spruce Ridge Studios will run the rug hooking store with a wide variety of supplies for sale during the retreat, beginning at 1 pm on Monday. If you have handmade items, small antique items, or used rug hooking equipment that you would like to sell in the store, please contact us for an inventory form. There is a 15% consignment fee for all items sold in the retreat store.

Cancellation Policy:

Cancellations must be received in writing. If you cancel before <u>February 15, 2024</u>, you will be refunded your registration fee, less \$50 for administrative fees. If you cancel after <u>February 15th</u> but before <u>August 15, 2024</u> and you will be refunded your registration fee, less \$100 for administrative fees. After <u>August 15, 2024</u> no refunds will be given for any reason. We do not allow tuition roll-overs from one year to the next. Lodging reservations must be cancelled with the Drury Plaza. Your signature on the registration form acknowledges that you understand and accept our cancellation policy.

Airport:

Nashville International Airport is 21 miles from the Drury Plaza.

Her workshops are filled with practical techniques in a relaxed and light-hearted atmosphere. Caroline started rug hooking in late 2005 when a local library offered a rug hooking class. She quickly found that she loved primitive colors, patterns, and textures. As her passion grew for rug hooking, she began to study under teachers such as Barb Carroll, Cynthia Norwood, and Jayne Hester. In 2011, she opened her studio, Eagles Nest Woolens, now featuring over 100 patterns listed on her website. She has been traveling and teaching the art of rug hooking since 2016. Her class focus will be on primitive patterns, colors, and cuts utilizing wider cut textured wools to achieve the feel of old rugs. Primitive colors do not mean a colorless palette. The backs of antique rugs often show brighter colors and have worn to the old dusty colors that we all love. In class, we will focus on the dusty and worn color palette with splashes of bolder colors when necessary. Caroline will also discuss ways to enhance the look and texture of your rug as well as eliminate some of your fear and doubts about your color planning skills.
